Evaluation Programme 2019–2021

Evaluation is an important instrument for an effective development policy. While different parts of the Norwegian development aid administration are responsible for reporting the results of individual aid interventions, the Evaluation Department has a particular responsibility for documenting the degree to which Norwegian development assistance is effective, relevant, and achieves the expected results.

The department is governed under a separate mandate and reports directly to the Secretaries General of the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Norwegian Ministry of Climate and Environment. The work of the department is carried out according to the principles described below.

Evaluations shall:

- » be conducted independently of those who are responsible for the administration and implementation of programmes and projects;
- » be conducted in accordance with recognised professional evaluation methods and principles;
- » seek to elucidate relevant issues:
- » put forward operational recommendations that may be utilised in the preparation of budgets and in further development of the activity being evaluated;
- » contribute to a constructive and open debate.

The evaluation programme has been developed in consultation with actors within and outside of the aid administration. The evaluation projects have been selected based on an assessment of significance, uniqueness and risk in Norwegian development cooperation, also taking account of the issues that are anticipated to be relevant during the programme period. The content of Reports to the Storting (government white papers) and budget proposals to the Storting have formed an important basis for this work.

General information about the programme

The Evaluation Programme for 2019–2021 will continue the focus from the previous period, with an emphasis on (i) private sector development and job creation and (ii) humanitarian assistance and support to countries affected by conflict and fragility. The programme also encompasses topics that are regarded as particularly relevant, including evaluations of climate and environmental assistance.



Continuation of ongoing evaluations and studies

Ideals and realities – assessment of the relationship between objectives and means in Norwegian aid to private sector development

The evaluation identifies the objectives of and instruments used in Norwegian aid to private sector development to assess whether the intentions embodied in government white papers are being followed up with means and resources. In addition, the evaluation will conduct an assessment of the underlying theory of change for the Norwegian support, and assess the extent to which this is based on knowledge from evaluations and research.

(Planned completion: 2nd quarter 2019)

Evaluation of methods for measuring iob creation

Job creation is an important objective of Norwegian private sector development. The evaluation will assess various methods of measuring whether the interventions contribute to job creation.

(Planned completion: 3rd guarter 2019)

Evaluation of means in aid to private sector development

Based on the evaluations described above, this evaluation will assess the effects of various types of private sector assistance and the correlation between the various means. In particular, the evaluation will assess development effectiveness, additionality and catalytic impact. The evaluation will choose case countries from sub-Saharan Africa.

(Planned completion: 1st quarter 2020)

Evaluations of Norwegian interventions in selected countries

The evaluations will assess the overall Norwegian assistance in selected countries. The country evaluations will – depending on country and context – assess issues relating to coordination of humanitarian and long-term assistance; involvement of local partners; organisation, planning and management of the Norwegian aid; involvement of those affected by crises; the rights-based orientation of assistance; and use of innovative instruments. The first two evaluations concern South Sudan and Somalia. A third country evaluation is set to begin later in the programme period.

(Planned completion of first two evaluations: 4th quarter 2019 and 1st quarter 2020, respectively)

Evaluation of effects of climate and forest initiatives at local level

The purpose of the evaluation is to assess the direct and indirect effects of Norway's efforts in the field of climate and forest initiatives at local level. Conducted in cooperation with the Global Environment Fund, the evaluation will carry out geocoding of the project data, which will be combined with relevant local geocoded data from other sources, such as satellite data and household surveys.

(Planned completion: 2nd quarter 2019)

Norway's participation in multilateral funds

The evaluation will identify the decision-making basis for allocating support through multilateral funds, and assess the funds' contribution in promoting Norway's priorities in these partnerships. The evaluation will assess the funds' mode of operation – operational efficiency, distribution of responsibility, follow-up, evaluation and auditing procedures. The evaluation will look at multilateral funds in the climate and forest, health, education and governance sectors.

Evaluations and studies commencing during the programme period

Conflict sensitivity in Norwegian development aid

The concept of conflict sensitivity has been of key importance in Norwegian development assistance for several years and is also a central concept in the document 'Strategic framework for Norwegian efforts in fragile states and regions' (Strategisk rammeverk for norsk innsats i sårbare stater og regioner) from 2017. The evaluation will identify and assess instruments for and approaches to conflict sensitivity in specific countries.

Evaluation of development support to the fisheries sector in southern Africa

Norway has supported the fisheries sector in various countries in southern Africa for several decades. The evaluation will assess the impact of this support in selected areas, such as marine research, maritime resource management and regional collaboration.

Synthesis study of development assistance to education

The study will assess and systematise findings from existing evaluations to seek to identify how to succeed in the efforts to reduce gender differences in education and ensure equal access to education for all. The study will be carried out in cooperation with the evaluation departments of UNESCO, UNICEF, the World Bank and the Global Partnership for Education.

Norway's anti-corruption efforts

The evaluation will focus on Norway's efforts to fight corruption during the last decade, both by assessing anti-corruption as a cross-cutting consideration in Norwegian development policy and in the form of more specific anti-corruption interventions.

Synthesis studies of development evaluations in partner countries

The efforts to systemise existing evaluation knowledge for Norway's partner countries began in 2016. To date, Country Evaluation Briefs have been completed for 11 partner countries. Studies of the remaining five partner countries (Uganda, Ghana, Niger, Indonesia and Colombia) will be launched during the programme period.

Study of follow-up and use of evaluations in Norwegian development cooperation

With the document 'Instructions for evaluation activities in Norwegian aid administration' (Instruks for evalueringsvirksomheten i norsk bistandsforvaltning), the Evaluation Department in Norad has been charged with initiating and implementing independent evaluations of Norwegian development cooperation. A main objective of evaluation activity is that the evaluations are to be used in future policy development and that they must serve as the basis for operational activity. This evaluation will assess whether the evaluations are used in line with this intention, whether the evaluations promote change, and if so, what kind of change. The evaluation will look at a selection of evaluations that were conducted in the period from 2008 to 2018.

Evaluation of Norway's efforts to advance the rights of people with disabilities

Support to authorities and organisations that work to improve the situation of people with disabilities and ensure their rights have been and is still important in Norwegian development cooperation. An evaluation of Norwegian efforts in the period 2000–2010 was published in 2012. A new evaluation of this area will focus on the support provided in the period from 2010 until today. The evaluation will document the Norwegian efforts and assess the results of this work.

Assessment of the quality of decentralised evaluations in Norwegian development aid administration

The Evaluation Department will carry out quality assessments of reviews and decentralised evaluations conducted by the Norwegian development aid administration. Annual reports of the compiled assessments and of the most important knowledge generated from these evaluations will be released.

Concentration of Norwegian development assistance

The purpose of concentration of Norwegian development assistance is to ensure better results. This evaluation will assess how concentration of Norwegian assistance is carried out and look at both the positive and the negative effects of concentration.

Evaluation of private sector participation in the Climate and Forest Initiative

The evaluation will survey and analyse the Climate and Forest Initiative's work to mobilise the private sector in the reduction of deforestation and forest degradation. The evaluation will focus on the efforts made through multilateral partners.

Evaluation of the portfolio orientation in new development assistance programmes

The evaluation will look at a small sample of new development assistance programmes, assess the extent to which the programme documents are consistent with a portfolio orientation, and make recommendations on how this can be strengthened.

Evaluation of Norwegian support for an integrated response to refugees and internally displaced persons in the Syrian region

The evaluation will assess Norwegian support to Syria and its neighbouring countries, including assistance for refugees and internally displaced persons. The evaluation will assess the humanitarian efforts and the correlation between the humanitarian efforts and long-term assistance, including the degree to which the efforts have helped to prevent, and create resilience towards, new crises.

Evaluation of Norwegian efforts for women, peace and security

Norway has been a driving force internationally to advance the agenda of women, peace and security for many years. The evaluation will survey and analyse the efforts to ensure that women's participation, influence, rights and needs are safeguarded as part of peace and security efforts. Action plans on women, peace and security will have a key role in the evaluation.

Long-term effects of Norwegian development assistance

The evaluation will assess the long-term effects of Norwegian development assistance in a selected partner country where Norway has maintained a presence for a minimum of 30 years through numerous instruments and initiatives. The evaluation will seek to identify lessons learnt about what is needed to ensure that development assistance has a long-term positive impact.

Collaboration and partnership with multilateral organisations

The Evaluation Department has ongoing collaborations with evaluation offices in selected multilateral organisations. The purpose of these collaborations are to share knowledge and contribute to learning. In the coming years the collaborations include the evaluation offices in UNDP, the Global Environment Fund (GEF), and UN Women.

Through the evaluation director's role as chair of the evaluation network in OECD / DAC, the Evaluation Department plays an active role in the work to finalize the revision of the OECD's evaluation criteria. These criteria are globally recognized as fundamental to good evaluation work. The revision is based on a broad international consultation.
